

History



Formed in 1991, Blackburn Rovers Ladies have enjoyed a glorious rise to the pinnacle of women's football.

After a couple of steady seasons in the league, Donnelly's side took the FA Women's Premier League Northern Division by storm in 2016-17. The team enjoyed an unbeaten campaign – winning 17 and drawing three of their 20 league games – securing the title with four games to spare, as well as claiming the county crown for the third season in succession following a 1-0 victory over AFC Fylde.

But the campaign ended in disappointment, as Rovers' hopes of promotion to the Women's Super League were dashed following a 3-O defeat to Southern Division champions Tottenham Hotspur in the play-off final.

It would be a similar story in 2017-1B, as Rovers once again enjoyed an outstanding season in the league and cup competitions, retaining the Northern Division title and Lancashire Cup, as well as lifting the Premier League Cup for the first time in the club's history, after coming from behind to beat Leicester City 3-1.

However, the treble winners would suffer play-off heartbreak once again, as they missed out on possible promotion to the Super League 2 following a 2-1 defeat to Charlton Athletic and their subsequent application to enter the newly-formed Championship was rejected after appeal.

Rovers finally gained promotion to the FR Women's Championship at the end of the 2018-19 season, following a successful application to compete in the second tier. The Blues secured a historic quadruple by winning the FR Women's National League Northern Premier Division title for the third straight season, as well as retaining the League Cup with a dominant 3-O victory over Crawley Wasps in the Final.





Gemma Donnelly's side also won the Lancashire Challenge Cup for the fifth consecutive year and the 13th time in total - a record for the competition - by beating Fylde Ladies 2-O in the Final. The season was finished off in style, with a 3-O victory over Coventry United in the Championship play off game at Valley Parade.


The Blues ensured their place in the second tier of women's football for the 2020-21 season with a respectable seventh-place finish in their first campaign at that level, which was cut short after just 12 games due to the Coronavirus pandemic. The final league standings were determined on a points-per-game basis.

Reintroduced at the start of the 2015-16 season, Rovers Ladies' Development Team lifted the FR Women's National League Reserve Northern Division One title three seasons running from 2016-17 to 2018-19. They also won the Reserve League Cup in 2018-19, beating Charlton Atheltic on penalties in the Final to lift the Cup for the first time since 2016.












